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MISSION & VISION

LEAD Public Schools prepares all of our students with the knowledge and skills to succeed in college and in life.

At LEAD Public Schools, we believe that every student has the potential to succeed in a challenging academic environment where rigor and scholastic excellence are balanced with character building, independence of thought, and joy of learning. It is our vision, therefore, that every student who attends a LPS High School will graduate and be accepted to a four-year college or post-secondary program.

COMMUNITY

LEAD Academy, a public charter school, opened in 2007 to serve students from low-income families zoned to persistently low-performing schools. The Tennessee Charter Law changed in 2011 so that all students were eligible to attend charter schools regardless of income or school zone. Now LEAD Academy is open to all students in Davidson County.

SCHOOL & PERFORMANCE

LEAD Academy's student body is predominately low-income, students of color, and first-generation college students.

- 55% come from non-English language background, 16% have limited English proficiency
- 27.6% were born in a different country (Egypt, Mexico, Honduras, El Salvador, Somalia, etc.)
- 51% are Economically Disadvantaged
- 56% African American, 30% Hispanic/Latino, 12% White (8% Egyptian) 1.7% Asian
- 13% receive Exceptional Education

LEAD Academy students consistently perform at or above the Metro Public Schools and the state in four of six English and math courses. Furthermore, LEAD specializes in accelerating learning for low-income students. When compared to the state our low-income students consistently outperform their peers in math, English, and science. Finally, in 2014-15 LEAD Academy was named a Tennessee Reward School for producing student growth rates in the top 5 percent of all schools in Tennessee.

ACCREDITATION

LEAD Academy High School is a public charter school within the LEAD Public Schools system and is fully accredited by Southern Association of Colleges and Schools/AdvancEd.

MEMBERSHIPS

The College Counseling Department memberships: College Board, National Association for College Admission Counseling, Southern Association for College Admission Counseling, and Tennessee Access and Support Network.

UNWEIGHTED GRADES

LEAD Academy does not weight student grades. In compliance with Tennessee state law, AP students receive five additional points and honors students receive three additional points for each quarter.

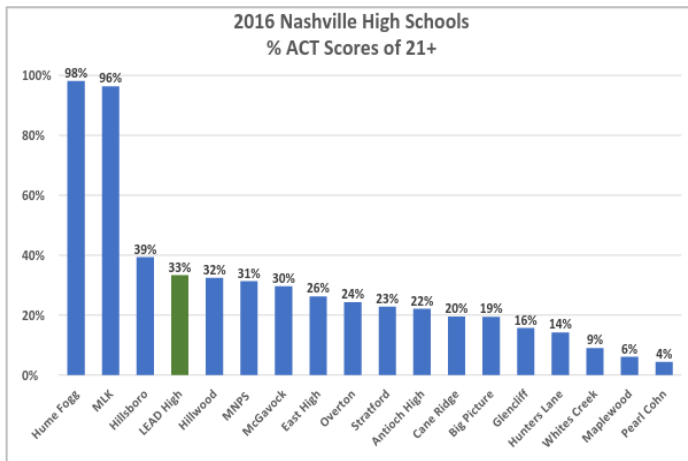
ADVANCED PLACEMENT
